## Legislative Recap

February 16, 2018

Here is the Legislative action from this week and the schedule for next week regarding all things retirement!

### This Week

#### Senate Session

The full Senate took up the following bill:

[HB561: Relative to part-time employment of a retirement system retiree by a participating employer.](#)

- The vote of Inexpedient to Legislate out of the Senate Finance Committee was overturned by a [Roll Call vote 11-13](#).
- Senator Bradley introduced an [amendment](#) that would push the bills effective date back to January 1, 2019. This amendment passed on a Voice Vote
- **Bill recommended Ought to Pass as Amended passed on voice vote**
- The bill will now go back to the House for concurrence or move to a committee of conference

This bill was heard last week, but the Sponsor has introduced a non-germane amendment, therefore they need to hold a public hearing on the amendment. The amendment simply changes the NH Retirement System Board of Trustees term limits from 2 years to 3 years.
